LUCKNOW: The UP investors Summit concluded on Thursday with President Ram Nath Kovind saying the progress of the state should make investors invest emotionally, as well as economically. In it and CM Yogi Adityanath emphasised the gathering that the investors had also shown interest in making an additional investment of Rs 4 lakh crore.

'Historical synergy clinched defence corridor for UP'

LUCKNOW: Defence minister Niravola Satharman on Thursday described Uttar Pradesh's sharing of the defence corridor "as a historical synergy between the centre and the state."

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had on Wednesday, while inaugurating the UP Investors Summit here, declared that the country's second defence equipment manufacturing corridor would be established in UP. He had said that the corridor, with an investment of about Rs 26,000 crore, would create 2.5 lakh new jobs.

"In 12 days flat, it is over the all-India first," Satharman said. "It is a historical synergy between the centre and the state."

UP's minister Niravola Satharman said the country's second defence equipment manufacturing corridor in UP will be to upgrade 11 production units and also set the import bill.

Satharman added, "But I could not have any secondary thinking at that stage. There I immediately told the Prime Minister that the UP CM had shown interest in getting the corridor and has made a request."
