More French companies may invest in UP, says ambassador



The French delegation had visited IIM Lucknow during its visit and will also be touring other universities in the state. The Ambassador said that France would like to extend cooperation with UP in the field of education, adding that they may even sign an MoU to this effect. He said several French companies were shifting base out of China and many were looking at India as a priority destination.
