

CM gives ₹706cr projects to Noida

Assures Hassle-Free Land Allotment

Noida: Unable to visit UP Foundation Day celebrations that were to be held at Noida Haat due to poor visibility, chief minister Yogi Adityanath addressed the gathering virtually from Lucknow on Monday.

On the occasion, the CM laid foundation stones and inaugurated 66 small and big projects worth Rs 706 crore in Noida via video conference from Lucknow.

Terming Gautam Budh Nagar as the emerging "financial capital" of the state, the CM also announced the roadmap for further industrial development in the district.

Listing out the infrastructure and industrial development projects that have been put on fast-track in his regime, Yogi added that the police commissionerate system in the city has also improved the law and order situation. "I wanted to be with you physically in Noida but due to poor weather conditions

and visibility, I could not make it to the event. Noida is the face of industrial development in the state and will continue to strive towards excellence," Yogi said.

From April 1, 2017, onwards, the city has attracted investments of more than Rs 40,000 crore. Sharing their achievements, GNIDA and YEIDA displayed the investments they have been able to secure for the city. While investments worth Rs 25,069 crore have poured into Greater Noida, YEIDA has been able to generate Rs 14,803 crore by launching half a

dozen schemes along the Yamuna Expressway.

Since new industrial sectors are being acquired and being developed for further use, Noida Authority has been able to corner a limited amount of investments over the past four years.

Yogi added, "I want to assure industry bodies and associations that our government is taking steps to ensure transparent and hassle-free allotment of land, better policing and security and complete support of the machinery for setting up industries."

Stating that his government took a progressive step by implementing the commissionerate system, Yogi said that four new police stations are being added for better patrolling. "I want to congratulate the entire department as it was the first government arm in the entire country to start doorstep delivery through 112 control rooms during the lockdown," Yogi said.
