

Samsung delegation hails UP govt for saving industry from Covid impact



LUCKNOW: A delegation of officials from Samsung which called on chief minister Yogi Adityanath on Sunday hailed the UP government's efficient Covid-19 management strategy with least impact on the industry and for letting industries operate during the corona-induced curfews.
