Noida, South Korean city sign MoU for investment, economic ties

LUCKNOW: Noida and Changwon City in the Republic of Korea signed a sister city agreement on Wednesday.

The agreement was signed between Noida Authority chairperson Sanjiv Mittal and the mayor of Changwon City Huh Sungmoo. Calling the agreement an effort to strengthen the traditional, cultural, and economic relations between South Korea and India, Sungmoo said he hoped for a mutual collaboration between the two cities on human resources, cultural, tourism and economic issues.

signing ceremony to invest in Noida.

It will also encourage industries to discover new opportunities of investment, trade, and technology. It will also help increase foreign investment in India and increase employment opportunities," an official said.
