

Govt has finished ₹3,200 cr projects in Rampur, says CM

'In 8 Months, 20 Industrial Units Have Been Set Up in Rampur'

Assuring the people that the double-engine government will work with a development-oriented approach, the CM said that both Central and state governments will ensure that benefits of the welfare schemes reach every person without any kind of discrimination on the mantra of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas aur Sabka Prayas'.

He said that the contribution of every section of the society -- ranging from craftsmen, artisans, youth, women, farmers, traders, and labourers -- is essential for the prosperity and the growth of the nation. Yogi called upon the people to work together with the government for making India prosperous and self-reliant by inviting investment and generating employment opportunities.

The CM categorically highlighted how Rampur's Amrit Sarovar got a mention in PM Modi's 'Mann ki Baat' programme. Yogi said

that his government completed projects worth Rs 3,200 crores in Rampur besides initiating programmes to usher in a new identity to the region.

"Incentives were provided to encourage investment. In the last eight months, 20 new industrial units have been established in Rampur. In these, an investment of Rs 540 crore has been made and 600 people have been directly employed while 4,500 people

have received indirect employment. Besides, three industrial units have also been set up giving employment to 1200 people," the CM said. Adityanath flayed the previous governments for converting schools, colleges, educational institutions here into party offices.

"The BJP worked to keep the heritage of the region intact by preserving and safeguarding institutions of historical importance,"

he said, underlining how his government encouraged Rampur's violin, Rampuri knife, Rampuri Topi, Zardozi and other related products to the handicrafts industry by linking them with programmes like Vishwakarma Shram Samman Yojana and ODOP.

The CM said that his government would not only establish Uttar Pradesh as a 'riot-free' state but also would link an individual in every family in the state with employment and self-employment opportunities in the next five years. He urged the people to encourage investment in all fields of education, agriculture, and health.

Meanwhile, the CM also provided financial assistance to 33 destitute girls and felicitated meritorious students by distributing tablets and smartphones. Nutritional kits were also provided to children. UP BJP chief Bhupendra Chaudhary and state general secretary (organisation) Dharampal Singh were also present on the occasion.
