Lucknow: Chief minister Yogi Adityanath said on Monday that the use of state-of-the-art technology and natural farming can boost agricultural production by three times.

Addressing the rabi productivity review seminar of Gorakhpur, Basti, Azamgarh and Devipatan divisions at Mahant Digvijaynath Park in Gorakhpur, Yogi said that it was time to promote cow based natural farming.

"With a little awareness and care, farmers can increase their income by getting more productivity at less cost through natural farming. Along with doing traditional farming in a modern way, farmers will also have to move towards horticulture, vegetable and cocropping farming on the basis of market demand and adaptability of agro-climatic zones. This will enable them to earn more," he said.

Yogi stressed that UP had the best fertile land and best water resources of the country. He said that by using quality seeds and technology in time, farmers can get success in increasing more productivity at less cost. The CM said that his government was helping the farmers by arranging seeds and water on time.

He said that during the pandemic only the productivity of the agriculture sector increased. "It was because of agriculture that the
