Wipe out dividing lines, join hands for prosperity, says Uttar Pardesh CM Yogi Adityanath

LUCKNOW: Chief minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday urged citizens to end divisions along the lines of caste, region, language and religion, which have "irreparably harmed Uttar Pradesh". He said that everyone must work together to take the state on the path of prosperity.

The CM said that BJP was taking the state out of darkness and towards development and it was necessary for everyone to follow Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' and expose divisive forces.



Speaking at the 74th Foundation Day of the state, now celebrated as UP Diwas, the CM stressed that even though the state had everything, it was PM Modi who gave it a "sense of pride and dignity". He also spoke about UP's role in the creation of modern India and how it had a prominent position in the country's fight for Independence. "Mangal Pandey in Barrackpore announced the start of the freedom movement, which was led by Rani Laxmibai from Jhansi, Bandhu Singh from Gorakhpur, and Dhan Singh Kotwal from Meerut. This state has seen both the Kakori train incident and the Chauri Chaura incident. This land belongs to freedom fighters and their countless sacrifices," the CM said.

Naimisharanya in Sitapur, he added, was also the origin of India's Vedic knowledge.

R ecalling that the celebrations of the state's foundation day were started under then Governor Ram Naik in 2017, the CM said that the government had launched its flagship scheme of 'one district-one product' on the occasion which has helped in doubling the state's exports in the past five years. "Before 2017, UP was known as the state of riots and a hub of criminal activities.

Today, it is referred to as the hub of exports. This is the inspiring story of the brand-new UP. Through the Global Investors Summit to be held between February 10- 12, investment worth lakhs for giving UP the opportunity to host 11 programmes of the G20. During the programme, Governor Anandiben Patel and the CM felicitated 16 artists with the Vivekananda Youth Award.
