'Cabinet meets soon in other cities'

During the meeting with the council of ministers on Tuesday, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said cabinet meetings are the "most important and formal forum for discussing public policy issues" and therefore, future meetings may be held in different cities other than Lucknow. The government has already held one cabinet meeting in Prayagraj on January 29, 2019 during the Kumbh. The cabinet had cleared proposals pertaining to the Ganga Expressway, Chitrakoot and Prayagraj during the meeting.

vestment proposals worth Rs 33.50 lakh crore being made through over 19,000 MoUs. Guests from 40 countries participated in the event, followed by representatives of 36 countries who came to Lucknow to attend a G20 meeting from February 13 to 15.

"Global Investors Summit-2023 was a huge success. Almost 10,000 investors showed up to make investments in UP. With more than Rs

33.50 lakh crore investment, this summit has set a record in the country. Record industrial investment has flowed into underdeveloped areas such as Bundelkhand and Purvanchal. The success of this summit will pave the way for making UP the biggest economy in the country," the CM said.

He directed ministers to visit the districts of their charge ahead of the budget

session scheduled to start from February 21 and meet entrepreneurs, the business class and youth. They have been told to involve the local public representatives to talk to people about the economic uplift of UP.

"The public should be informed about how this summit is going to make Uttar Pradesh the growth engine of the country's economy. Inform them about the job opportunities being created for the youth. All ministers should immediately review the industrial investment proposals received by their respective departments. We have to organise a ground-breaking ceremony in the next six months by launching a large number of investment proposals on the ground," Yogi said.

Lucknow: With just a year to go for general elections, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath will market the investors summit as a milestone in achieving industrial growth in UP and generating employment opportunities for the youth. On Tuesday, he asked all ministers to tour their respective districts and talk to people about the success of the summit and work towards ensuring at least one ground-breaking ceremony is held within six months.

In a meeting with council of ministers, the CM also emphasised the need to hold meetings with the youth to apprise them how useful the summit will be in generating employment opportunities.
