CM Seeks Plans For 59 AMRUT Cities

According to sources, Kanpur and Kanpur Dehat are not going to be part of the SCRDA.

Sources said that CM was not satisfied with the progress being made by the department to give shape to the state capital region in its present form.

To push for rapid urbanisation with available resources without waiting further, the scope of the state capital region was redefined. It was decided to elevate the Lucknow Development Authority (LDA) as the key driving engine for the state.

the view that urban planning in the state should be done in a way that Lucknow and neighbouring districts act as one holistic urban centre and Kanpur, and its neighbouring districts -- which are separated by the Ganga -- develop as the second growth engine.

UP to set up new 'Ayush Board'

Lucknow: To streamline procedures for establishing and developing new institutions and simplifying the registration of degree-holding doctors of the Indian medical system, the UP government has decided to establish an integrated 'Ayush Board'.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath issued directions for this during the Ayush department meeting on Friday. The CM stated that currently, three separate boards are overseeing Ayurvedic, Unani, and homeopathy medical systems. "There is now a need to integrate these under one board to provide them

with a unified appearance," he said.

He also emphasised that, with changing times, there is a growing interest among youth in pursuing careers in yoga and naturopathy, with numerous proposals coming from the private sector for establishing such institutes. "So, action should be taken to regulate these institutions and register doctors under the Ayush Board," he said.

Yogi said that the proposed Ayush Board will be headed by the Director General, with different director-level officers responsible for Ayurveda, Unani, Homeopathy, Yoga, Naturopathy, and Siddha systems.

In accordance with the CM's guidelines, the Ayush Act of Uttar Pradesh will be prepared soon, and all necessary provisions will be included in the new Act to create favourable opportunities for the promotion of these Indian medical systems.

The CM also emphasised that the standards set for institutions should be practical. During the meeting, the CM pointed out that encouraging Indian medical systems, like yoga and naturopathy, will be instrumental in making UP a health hub. "Special efforts should also be made to promote research studies and patents in the new institutes to be established in the state," he said.
