

Govt's steps to improve law and order have transformed UP: CM

The CM said that students from ITIs, polytechnics, and degree colleges should get integrated with certificate and diploma courses so that they are trained in programmes tailored to the needs of the industry.

Stating that six years ago, anarchy was at its peak in UP and no investor was willing to invest here, CM said that steps taken to improve law and order together with implementation of reforms associated with ease of doing business, has transformed UP.

“Due to this transformation, the state received pro-



posals for an investment of Rs 38 lakh crore at the Global Investor Summit. This will directly provide jobs to 1 crore 10 lakh youths,” he said.

Mentioning about the dairy, he said that the plant with the capacity of five lakh litres of milk daily will indirectly benefit around one lakh families.

Additionally, it will ensure direct employment for 300 people while 1,500 others will be associated with the operation of the plant.

Yogi emphasized that there has been a recent influx of investment in Go-

rakhpur Industrial Development Authority (GIDA), which includes companies like Gallantt, Ankur TMX, Varun Beverages, PepsiCo and Tatva Plastics.

This has brought a new wave of development in Eastern Uttar Pradesh, particularly in Gorakhpur, creating opportunities for employment and economic growth.

CM said that while initially GIDA was limited to a few villages around Sahjanwa, today it is expanding till Dhuliya area.

The Gorakhpur Link Expressway is being connected to the Purvanchal Expressway, and industrial units will be established along

both expressways. This expansion will create numerous job and employment opportunities, the CM claimed.

He also emphasized that entrepreneurs making investments will not face any problem.

Earlier, CM Yogi inspected the dairy product plant and felicitated five employees who contributed to the operation of the plant by presenting them with certificates of appreciation. The programme was attended by Gorakhpur MP Ravi Kishan Shukla, District Panchayat president Sadhana Singh, mayor Mangalesh Shrivastav, Sahjanwa MLA Pradeep Shukla, and other dignitaries.
