Brazilian Firms Sign MoU With UP-Based Dairy

Lucknow: Chief minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday said that bilateral trade between India and Brazil has doubled in the last two years. He said that the exports from India to Brazil have gone up to \$4.5 billion in the financial year 2022-23 whereas the imports from Brazil to India have increased to \$7.14 billion.

The $^{\rm CM}$ added that among the major focus areas of bilateral cooperation between India and Brazil were agriculture, food processing and animal husbandry. The cattle of Brazil and India have similar genetic heritage, he said, adding that Indian cattle like Gir and Kankrei which were exported centuries ago, have been bred to yield large quantities of milk.
