









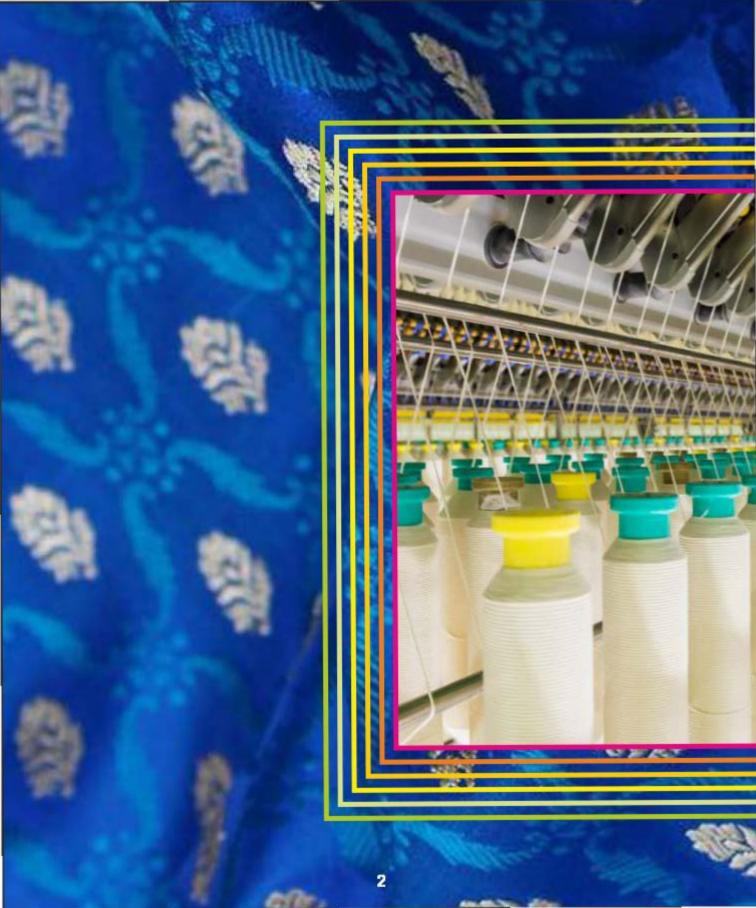

GLOBAL SCENARIO

- The global apparel market size is expected to reach INR 1,69,00,000 Cr in 2025.
- A large & growing domestic demand coupled with increasing spending power of people in India and China will
 result in the combined addition of around INR 32,50,000 Cr in the global apparel market size by 2025.³
- Region wise, Asia Pacific and Western Europe are leading markets contributing 35.6% and 22.8% respectively in 2016.¹
- Moderate growth in recent years has increased industry competitiveness. With fast changing consumer
 preferences, players are required to create strong brand consciousness and run intensive marketing campaign to
 retain market shares.
- India has to take advantage of lower labour cost and high domestic demand, focussing on value added textile segments to emerge as global leader in textile and apparel.

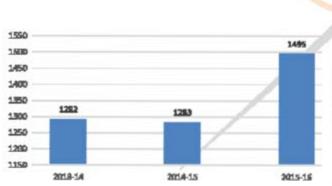
TEXTILE SECTOR- INDIA SCENARIO

- India is the 2nd largest textile fibre producer in the world with production of around 90 Lakh tonnes in 2015-16.
- It is the largest cotton and jute producer and the second largest producer of slik in the world.
- Textile industry in india accounts for nearly 15.1% (by value) of total exports in the country.
- India has the second largest textile manufacturing capacity globally, accounting for 18% of world's spindles and 9% of world's rotor and has a share of 5% in global textiles and apparel trade.
- Textile and apparel sector is the second largest employment provider in the country, employing nearly 51 Million people directly and 68 Million people indirectly in 2015-16.
- The Industry has strong infrastructure with around 24 Lakh looms of varied designs and construction Indicating significant production capacity.



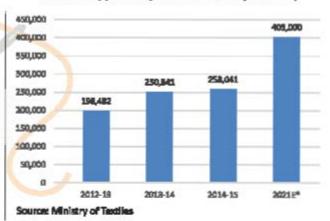

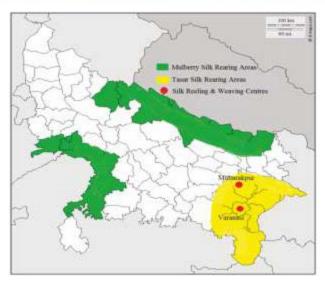
Textile & Apparel Exports from India (in INR Cr)

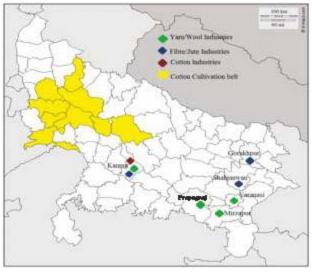


UTTAR PRADESH SCENARIO

- Textile sector is one of the important traditional industries in the State. Uttar Pradesh is the third highest fabric
 producing State of India producing 13.24% of the national production.
- The State ranks 5th in total silk production in the country.
- Uttar Pradesh has 58 spinning mills and a total of 74 textile mills in the non-SSI sector.
- The State has fifth highest number of handlooms in India. Uttar Pradesh has about 2.58 Lakh Handloom weavers and about 5.50 Lakh power loom weavers.
- The State is also known for its carpets and produces around 90% of India's carpets.
- Uttar Pradesh is the largest market for textile and handloom, with a consumer base of over 204 Million people.







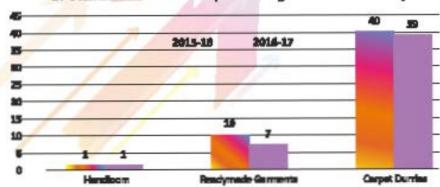
Silk Belt in UP - Illustrative Image

Key Handloom and Textile Clusters

Most significant clusters for handloom and textile in Uttar Pradesh include:

Carpet cluster Mirzepur-Bhadohi

- Bhadohi is known as the 'carpet city' of India. It is the largest manufacturer and exporter of hand-knotted carpets in India.
- The region is the largest handmade carpet weaving cluster engaging 3.2 million people and 22,00,000 artisans in its
 export units.
- Bhadohi region accounts for almost 50% of India's carpet export industry.

Silk Cluster Varanasi

- Varanasi Slik Handloom Cluster is world famous and its dominance continues in producing best quality slik fabrics, particularly sarees.
- Varanasi silk saree / fabric with heavy embroidery work provides several variations in designs and colour making it exclusive.
- Varanasi contributes 090-95% in silksaree production in Uttar Pradesh.
- Other products include, dress materials and fashion accessories such as stole, scarves, etc.

Availability of skilled, semi-skilled human resource

- With a total population of more than 204 Million, Uttar Pradesh boasts of a labour force of over 70 Million of which over 40 Million are non-agricultural labour force.
- Rich in traditional arts, the State has abundance of skilled labour readily available at competitive cost for textile sector.
- Premier institutes such as National Institute of Fashion Technology, Raebarell offers courses in textile design, leather design and fashion technology and management; Uttar Pradesh Textile Technology institute, Kanpur offers undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in textile technology and engineering; Indian Institute of Handloom Technology, Varanasi offers diploma courses in Handloom technology; etc.
- Integrated skill development scheme (ISDS)— Centrally sponsored scheme is successfully running in the State to address the skilled manpower of textile industry. Around 10,000 people far total 9922 persons have been trained under this scheme in the State. Total INR 7.75 Cr have been released under the scheme to UPICA GoUP in 2016-17.





GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

Government Schemes and Initiatives

- Prime Minister Handloom weavers Mudra Scheme Under the scheme handloom weavers get loans at only 6% interest rate.
- Marketing Assistance The Government provides marketing assistance to weavers in handloom sector, wherein
 grants are given by Gol (Government of India) to State Government to host exhibitions and fairs. As of 2017-18,
 total sales made through government supported fairs and exhibitions amount to some INR 11.63 Cr.
- The State Government under Powerloom Development Scheme provides INR 1 Lakh grant on setting up Semi
 automatic, Powerloom, and INR 45,000 for setting up worksheds and INR 5,000 per weaver for training. Around
 1,330 weavers are expected to benefit from the scheme.
- Logistics Support In order to ensure continuous quality power supply in Hnadloom Clusters and areas, separate
 feeders are provided. In the financial year 2017-18, two such feeders are planned in Gorakhpur. Government of
 Utter Pradesh has already sanctioned and released INR 5 Cr for this purpose. Rebate/ Subsidy in the electricity bills
 is provided to Handloom and Powerloom Weavers.
- Cluster Development Programme In order to support strengthening of naturally existing clusters in the State and
 also to develop new clusters in the State, the State Government is supporting the implementation of Cluster
 Development Programme of Government of India.



Highlights of the Handloom, Power-loom, Silk, Textile and Garmenting Policy 2017

Incentives for Textile Units

Stamp Duty

- 100% exemption (except in GB Nagar district).
- 75% exemption in GB Nagar district.
- 100% exemption to Sericulture chaald, keys production, threading units.
- 100% exemption on land purchased for the development of infrastructure facilities.

SGST

Net SGST reimbursement subject to an annual upper limit of 25% of fixed capital investment (Land, Building, other Construction and Plant & Machinery for period of 10 years-

- 90% for MSME textile units.
- 80% for Mega and Super-Mega.
- Non-MSME units -
 - 90% in Poorvanchal and Bundelkhand
 - 75 % in Madhvanchal and Pashchimanchal
 - 60 % in GB Nagar district

Energy

100% exemption from electricity duty will be given to new units for 10 years.

Mandi fees

Purchase of raw materials will be exempted from Mandi Fee for a period of 5 years.

Interest Subsidy

 7% on loan taken for procurement of TUFS eligible plant & machinery for period of 7 years subject limit of INR 1.5 Cr per year and INR 75 Lakh in GB nagar district.

Infrastructure Interest Subsidy

 5% on loans taken for developing infrastructural amenities for period of 5 years subject to cap of INR1.00 Cr per unit.

Quality Development Subsidy

 5% on loan taken for research, quality improvement & development of textile products by textile industry association and group of textile industrial units for a period of 5 years subject to a cap of INR 1.
 Cr per lab.

Capital Subsidy

- 25% subsidy for plant and machinery subject to following limit and conditions:
- 20% for slik realing units with capital investment of minimum INR 1 Cr.
- 15% margin money as capital subsidy for units for rearing of chaaki worm, keya production, realing and spinning in sericulture sector, for SC/ST and women his subsidy will be 20%.

- EPF reimbursement
- 50% for 5 years for new textile units which provide employment to minimum 100 workers.
- 60% for 5 years for units which provide employment to minimum 200 workers.

Land

- 50% of land cost will be reimbursed for land bought from State Government agencies.
- 30% subsidy in case of Gautam Budh Nagar.

Special Incentives for Textile Parks

- 50% of annual interest on purchase of land for 7 years subject to maximum limit of INR 1 Cr per annum with cumulative limit of INR 50 Cr.
- 100% exemption on stamp duty to developers of textile park (except in GB Nagar district).
- 50% exemption on stamp duty to first buyer of plot/unit in every park.
- 60% subsidy on annual interest for 7 years for construction of staff-quarters, hostel/dormitory.
- 100% exemption from stamp duty to developers of staff quarters/hostels/dormitories for purchase of land (except in GB Nagar district).

Employment Generation subsidy

 INR 3,200 per employed person per month to mega and super mega garmenting units for 5 years in all districts except Gautam Buddh Nagar and Ghaziabad.

Case-to-Case Basis-Financial caps as per the policy may be relaxed on Case-to-Case basis.

Plug and Play facility

The State government will provide complete, ready to use standard sized sheds and other facilities, on rent to potential enterpreneurs in the garmenting sector through its agencies like UPSIDC, other industrial development authorities, urban development authorities and Housing Development Board

FREIGHT REIMBURSEMENT

For export promotion freight reimbursement will be provided to new units as follows:

- 75% for first 2 years.
- 50% for next 2 years.
- 25% for the 5th years.

INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

There are numerous investment opportunities across value chain in Garmenting, Dyeing, Fabric production, Spinning etc.

- a. Fibre Production- In India, Uttar Pradesh offers huge scope for man-made fibre and filament manufacturing. With change in consumer preferences and awareness about health and hygiene, consumption of man made fibres is poised to grow in future.
- b. **Spinning-** The spinning sector in UP is highly advanced and competent globally in terms of price, quality and standards, offering cheap skilled labour. It is likely to grow further and adopt new technologies.
- c. Weaving- India forms world's highest installed weaving capacity, and UP holds a strong position. There is already achieved strength in manufacturing of knitted and woven fabric however opportunities in value added and specialty fabrics still need to be explored.
- d. Stitching-Given the abundant labour force with high rates of female labour force participation in the textile sector, the state has potential to be a part of global value chain through stitching for the apparel industry.

- e. Apparel- It is estimated that apparel sector generates 56-84 jobs per INR 97.5 Lakh investment as compared to any other industry average of 6 jobs generated per INR 97.5 lakh investment. Looking at the high employment generating potential, Government of India has extended various benefits to this sector. In Uttar Pradesh, investors can benefit from the market access arrangement in India with countries like Japan, South Korea, ASEAN, Chile, Netherlands, etc.
- f. Technical Textiles is a knowledge based industry at a nascent stage in India, which offers tremendous opportunities for joint ventures and FDI. The market size of Technical Textiles in India was estimated to be INR 1.5 Lakh Crores for the year 2016-17 with a growth rate of 20% per annum. Uttar Pradesh can be a promising destination to invest in manufacturing technical textiles in India.

- g. Integrated Textile and Apparel Parks There is also scope for integrated factories from spinning to weaving and garmenting with high automation, especially for the domestic fashion market. Integrated units can leverage economies of scale and market access benefits of set-ups in Uttar Pradesh and cater to the fast fashion requirement of consumers. Uttar Pradesh will not only create maximum job but also contribute to textile exports of India. Proposed Textile park regions include Fatehpur, Kanpur, Bareilly and Farukkhabad in the State.
- h. Retail Brands- The capital market in multi brand retailing allows 51% FDI in India, Uttar Pradesh is one of the most promising destination to set up multi brand retail businesses through Joint Ventures, since Uttar Pradesh has the largest consumer base.
- E-Commerce- With boom in e-commerce sector, investment in IT for handloom and textile products manufactured
 in Uttar Pradesh is a promising opportunity. There is a popular demand for the traditional art and finesse of UP
 handloom products across the globe.
- j. Textile R&D Centres- Investment in R&D for new product development by way of establishing hi-tech production centres, design studios, training centres is another promising opportunity in Uttar Pradesh in this sector. These centres can be started as incubation centres in existing textile institutes and textile parks, already equipped with skilled and semi-skilled labour and abundance of raw materials.

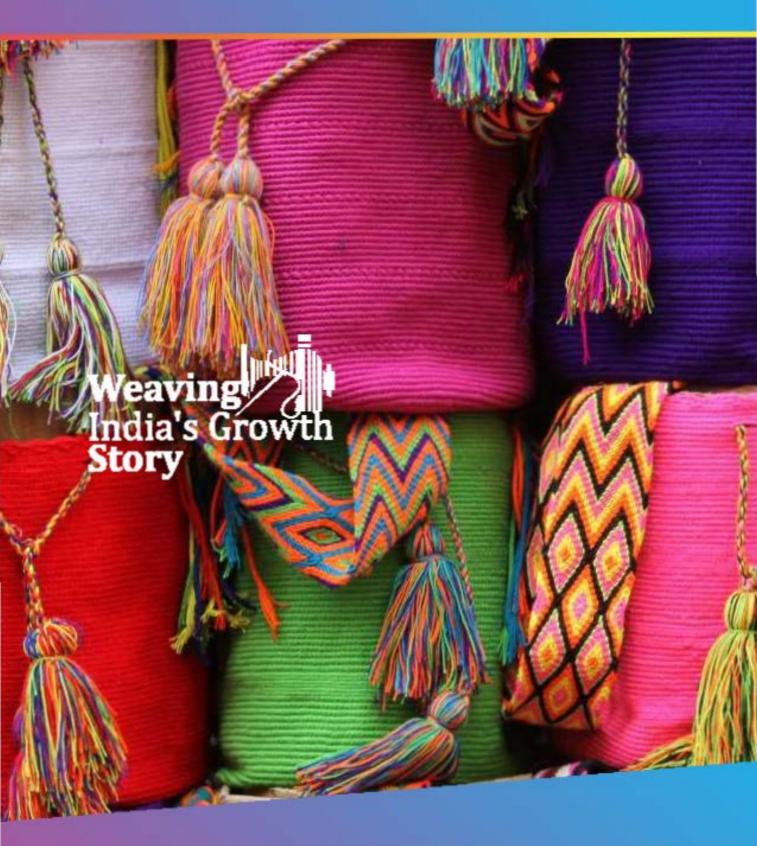
















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
