

Exports from UP rose by 30% in last fiscal: CM

Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said on Wednesday that exports from Uttar Pradesh increased by 30% over the previous year and congratulated the industrialists, exporters, and public for the achievement.

Yogi said exports increased by Rs 35,000 crore in the last fiscal to a grand total of Rs1.56 lakh crore in 2021-2022.

“From Rs 88,000 crore in 2017, UP’s exports have doubled to Rs. 1.56 lakh crore in the last five years,” he said, crediting the improvement to the robust policy framework, schemes like One District One Product which gave a boost to the manufacturing of traditional handicrafts and provided them the necessary market linkages.

Uttar Pradesh has made notable achievements in industrial development over the last five years and the government is making concerted efforts to make the state a trillion-dollar economy, Yogi said.

Expressing satisfaction over the increase in exports, the CM directed officials to ensure that the export facilitation mechanism at district level is further strengthened.

Talking about the way forward, the CM told officials to address the problems faced by manufacturers and exporters on a case-to-case basis so that no bottlenecks are faced by them.

Lauding the exemplary work done during the crisis time wrought by the coronavirus pandemic, the CM said the same sense of commitment must be carried forward to scale higher levels of success.
