

With 'Namaste', French firm exec brings fresh 'air' to meet

Lucknow: Sharing the plans of Air Liquide Limited, the French multinational company which produces and supplies industrial gases, its vice-president Matthieu Eyries said the company's first plant is going to be commissioned in UP by the end of this year. Beginning his address by greeting the audience with a Namaste, Eyries said that this is going to be the fifth plant in the country. The company is setting up a plant in Kosi, Mathura which will produce 350 tonnes of oxygen, nitrogen and argon.

"Air Liquide is very proud to join the community of UP. I would also like to thank the authorities who are working diligently to make this region a preferred destination for foreign investors. The land was allotted to us in a very short span of time, and we were able to expedite funding for this plant," said Eyries.

The plant will enhance the capacity of the company to serve its customers in North India and boost the state economy and job opportunities. The plant holds a lot of importance for the population of the state as it is being designed to fulfil the medical oxygen demand of UP. "To serve vital systems of local industrial ecosystem, our products will be used for manufacturing applications, welding, cutting, for environmental preservation, wastewater treatment and will contribute to abating decarbonisation in sectors like the cement industry," said Eyries.
