

Uttar Pradesh: Development should reach last person, says CM Yogi Adityanath

LUCKNOW: The state government will be issuing licences for setting up plywood factories in the Saharanpur district. During a visit to Saharanpur and Shamli on Wednesday, chief minister Yogi Adityanath directed officials to ensure that this work was done on priority and said that if there was any delay in implementing development projects, strict action would be taken against the officials concerned.

During a meeting with officials from the division, the CM said that all works should be done without any bias to benefit all persons.

"It is the government's agenda to ensure that the benefits of all schemes reach every last person. If any party worker, post holder or public representative faces a problem, you should get a complaint registered on the CM's helpline. If any official is irresponsible in implementing

development works, action will be taken against them," he said.

Yogi Adityanath visited the Saharanpur and Shamli districts on Wednesday to take stock of the ongoing development works in the region and gave instructions to give pace to the various projects while ensuring that growth reaches all sections of the society

During his visit, Yogi held a meeting with the public representatives and inspected the progress of the Ma Shakumbhari Devi University, which is under construction in Saharanpur.

Thereafter, he also conducted a surprise inspection of the Government Medical College and held a review meeting of the Saharanpur Division. The CM also reviewed preparation for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. He held a meeting with public representatives and took their feedback.

"While infusing enthusiasm among the workers, the CM said that one should ensure that they are respected," a government spokesperson said. The CM then inspected the Rs 100 crore integrated command and control system and said that it should be made functional at the earliest.

From Saharanpur, the CM went to Shamli where he inspected a 400 kV powerhouse constructed at a cost of Rs 738 crore. From there, he visited Mother Land Public School where he interacted with the students.
