341km-long Purvanchal Expressway functional besides dedicating 296km-long Bundelkhand Expressway to the public.

Experts say both the expressways would expedite the development of Bundelkhand and Purvanchal regions which had been infamously dubbed as 'backward'.

The work for Gorakhpur Link Expressway and the 594km-long Ganga Expressway is progressing fast.

The government has also cleared decks for development of the Ballia Link expressway which will connect Ghazipur with Ballia.

In addition to the infrastructure, the government is pushing development projects to boost regional and local economies that will create jobs and improve overall quality of life of people.

The Mega Food Park is coming up in Bareilly at an expenditure of Rs 90 crore, the Medical Device Park is coming up at Greater Noida at an expenditure of Rs 439 crore and the Film City coming up in Noida.

The government has also launched the Atal Industrial Infrastructure Mission to build and boost infrastructure development in industrial zones.

Keeping in mind the future needs of the industry sector, the government is in the process of developing an artificial intelligence and machine learning centre of excellence in Noida.
