

Bizmen from eight countries to explore opportunities in Ayodhya

Ayodhya: A delegation of business persons representing eight countries visited the temple town of Ayodhya and were taken on a tour of land parcels available for different business projects.

Deputy director of UP tourism department, Rajendra Prasad, said that there is a possibility of MoUs with these foreign investors for different projects in the proposed Investors' Summit in Lucknow in November-December.

Prasad said that the investors were interested in fields like theme parks, light shows, resort development, wellness centres, renewable energy, skill development

and film-media, besides FMCG etc. There is a potential for investment of US\$2 billion in these sectors, he said.

They were given an overview of 30 acres of land ac-

quired by the tourism department near the Korean monument located on the banks of the Saryu. The delegation also inspected the 80 acres of land acquired earlier for the

installation of the world's tallest statue of Lord Rama at Manjha Barhatha area. The proposed greenfield township of the Housing Development Council in Shah-nawaz Pur was also shown to them.

The delegation of foreigner business persons who visited Ayodhya include Taki-ta Yoshinori of Japan, Hilen-Jung-hee from Republic of Korea, Francis Oliver and Cumber Bach of South American country Guyana, Alex Andre of Vietnam, Shandal Patrick from California, Jessica Vulcan of Peru, Maria Angel Ladora of Ecuador.
