

UPSIDA to address industries' grievances

Lucknow: To garner support from the investors and entrepreneurs operating within the industrial clusters close to Lucknow ahead of the Global Investors Summit (GIS) next year, Uttar Pradesh State Industrial Development Authority (UPSIDA) has constituted a team of officers to take note of the grievances of industrial associations.

The team has been asked to visit 11 industrial areas in Amethi, Barabanki, Ayodhya and Barabanki this week. The chief executive officer of the authority,

Mayur Maheshwari had asked the senior officials of his department to interact with the local office bearers of the industrial associations such as Laghu Udyog Bharti, Indian Industries Association, Emerging Business Chamber of Commerce among others.

Principal general manager of the authority Rajeev Tyagi said that the team members have already visited Jagdishpur, Tikariya and Trishundi in Amethi, Sandila in Hardoi, Kursi in Barabanki and site 1 and site 2 in Ayodhya. Some of the common problems pointed out by the owners of the industrial units

active in these pockets related to irregular maintenance of roads, poor condition of the streetlights, providing proper drainage facilities, setting up public toilets and urinals.

“We do not have any open space or parks within industrial areas. Parks and green space are also needed within industrial clusters,” said Apoorva Mishra, who runs a manufacturing unit in Jagdishpur area of Amethi. The team is paying attention to developing infrastructure in Amethi as investments worth more than Rs 700 crore are going to be infused in Trishundi industrial area.
