



## Green hydrogen plan gets nod from Cabinet

**NEW DELHI:** In an additional move aimed at improving India's energy security and helping the country cut carbon dioxide emissions, the Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday approved an initial outlay of ₹18,744 crore for the National Green Hydrogen Mission up to 2029-30, including incentives to attract investments worth ₹8 lakh crore and create 600,000 direct jobs. The mission is expected to cut around 50 million tonnes of carbon emissions.

Saying the expected deliverables of the mission after the meeting, information and broadcasting minister Anand Singh Thakur said, "We will have annual production of 5 million tonnes of green hydrogen. It will not only reduce 50 million tonnes of carbon emissions. Not only that, it will lead to [cumulative] savings of ₹1 lakh crore in fossil fuel imports."

Hydrogen produced using renewable energy to split water (electrolysis) is termed as "green hydrogen" as opposed to "grey hydrogen" produced from fossil fuel. India plans to invest in developing an electrolysis capacity for electrolyser capacity of 10-100 GW as part of the effort to produce green hydrogen, Thakur added.

age of ₹17,490 crore under the approved mission — about ₹4,500 crore is set aside for manufacturing of electrolyser cells/breakdown water into hydrogen and oxygen in next five years, and ₹10,000 crore for producing green hydrogen in the next three years, according to an official who requested anonymity.

Besides that, the mission also set aside ₹1,466 crore for pilot projects, ₹400 crore for research and development (R&D), and ₹388 crore for other components of the mission, the

## Pant airlifted to Mumbai for further treatment

**MUMBAI:** Five days after injuries suffered in a serious accident near his home town Bikaner after his car slipped over and burst into flames, India wicketkeeper Rishabh Pant left the hospital in Dehradun and was flown to Mumbai by air ambulance for further treatment.

The 29-year-old, who was being treated for injuries on his forehead and right knee, wrist, ankle and toe and abrasions on

the back at the Max Hospital in the Uttarakhand capital, landed in Mumbai on Wednesday evening and was admitted to Aushahi's Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital (KDAH).
