

UK firm to revolutionize commercial EV space

Lucknow: The United Kingdom-based Causis group, which emerged as one of the biggest investors during the Global Investors Summit, is set to revolutionize the overall electric vehicle ecosystem with its green mobility push.

Sensing massive opportunity in the sector, the group is going to launch commercial electric vehicles for both public and commercial transport modes.

Committed to pump in Rs 1.25 lakh crore in UP, the firm is going to develop mass transit ecosystem.

Chief executive officer of the group, Ram Tumuluri said: "The company plans to produce 40,000 buses in next five years. Under Make in UP concept we are going to invest Rs 80,000 crore within a short span of time."

The company is determined to create an ecosystem for manufacturing, production and charging of heavy commercial electric vehicles that are going to be deployed within the government public transport department.

Sharing the need to introduce commercial vehicles, a senior executive from the company said in a few

years entry of diesel-powered vehicles will be completely prohibited within the metro cities of the country.

"But at the same time freight corridor and transport hubs are coming up near Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru and

cities. We will provide electronic commercial vehicles that will work as normal trucks and loaders and will have capacity of carrying goods within 200-km range. A lot of small and heavy commercial vehicle operators will have to shift to green energy and we are going to be the company to provide such vehicles," said another executive.
