## State made giant industrial strides, nine-fold growth in investment: CM

Lucknow: Recounting the giant strides UP has taken in the field of industrial development, CM Yogi Adityanath on Saturday said that from Rs 4 lakh crore worth investment portfolio in 2018, the state is looking forward to secure investments worth Rs 35 lakh crore through the global investors summit organised in February this year, a ninefold growth trajectory not seen in any other state of the country within five years.

To achieve holistic development of Uttar Pradesh, Yogi credited his core team of ministers and officers for identifying 10 priority sectors within the first year of its second tenure. With objectives set, the Yogi government appointed an additional chief secretary-rank officer to monitor the headway being made under each priority sector through a centralised online dashboard.

Sharing more details, a senior government officer said that 241 regulatory compliance hurdles have been removed to speed up industrial growth



in the state. "For the first time, UP has direct access to a port. A waterway has been established between Varanasi and Haldia in West Bengal last year which will help us in exporting goods," said Yogi.

From two operational airports in 2017, the state has nine airports. Yogi also assured the crowd which had gathered to listen to him that within the next two years, UP will be the only state in the country to have five operational international airports.

Network of expressways have already improved connectivity to backward parts of Bundelkhand and Purvanchal and industrial corridors are being set up in the two ignored regions, the CM said.

For the first time musaher, tharu, vantangiya, kol, sahariya caste and community members have been brought into the mainstream and have been able to draw the benefits of the government schemes, said Yogi.
