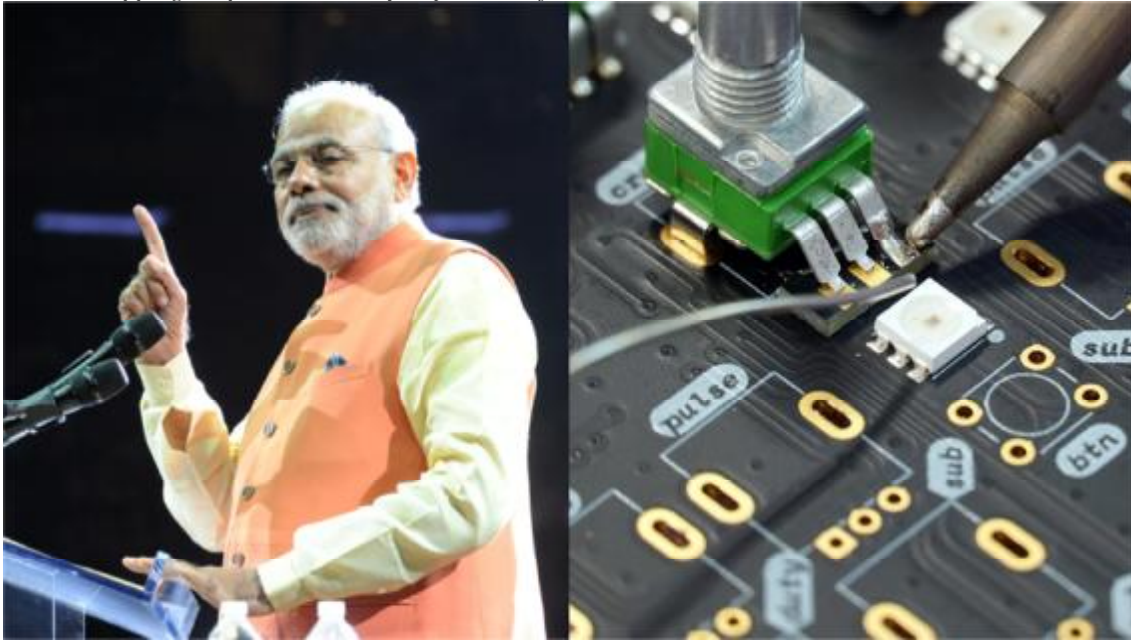


# Modi Govt To Reopen MASSIVE USD10 Billion Incentives For Semiconductor Manufacturing, Looking To Make India Global Player In This Industry
