Chopper service facility to take flight in UP

Cabinet Approves Proposal To Lease Agra, Mathura Heliports

Lucknow: UP tourism department is set to start helicopter services in the state. with the cabinet approving the proposal to give on lease of 30 years the heliports in Agra and Mathura to Rajas Aerosports and Adventures Pvt

The cabinet meeting was chaired by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.

Principal secretary, tourism, Mukesh Meshram said that the company will be managing and operating chopper services from these heliports to any destination in the country, to be decided by the company keeping in mind the traffic. "This is the first time that the UP tourism department is operating such a service. In the second phase, services will be started in Lucknow, Prayagraj and Kapilvastu and subsequently in Varanasi and Ayodhya. Over the next two to four years, we

will start services from 20-25 cities in UP," he said.

The heliports will be given on lease to Rajas Aerosports and Adventures Pvt Ltd for Rs 25,00,500 per year.

Based on the financial model of the two heliports, department consultancy firm KPMG finalised the floor base price at Rs 13.50 lakh, against which the bid price by the firm is 85.20% higher.

Under the condition for the lease, the selected firm has to pay Rs 2,03,84,000 before the contract is executed. The lease is for 30 years. The developer will be given two years development work after which the lease will be renewed for 30 years.

The cabinet also cleared a proposal to establish an integrated sugar complex in Chhata, in Mathura district. This will have a 3,000 ton per day capacity sugar mill, which will be expanded to 4,900 tons per day. The sugar mill at Chhata has been shut since 2009. In

place of that, the government has decided to set up a modern integrated complex. Along with refined sugar, the plant will produce cane juice, C-heavy and B-heavy ethanol. The complex will benefit around 50,000 farmers in a 20 km radius around the plant. The mill area will have canteen. café, general store and a workshop for repair of tractors and trucks.

The government will get an additional revenue of Rs 10 crore per year through this.
