CM Yogi watches MotoGP's final race, presents trophy


Union Mins Anurag Thakur, Hardeep Singh Puri Accompany CM

Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath attended the final race of the MotoGP at the Buddh International Circuit in Greater Noida on Sunday and also presented the competition's trophy to the winner, Marco Bezzecchi.

Union sports and youth affairs minister Anurag Thakur and Union minister for petroleum and natural gas Hardeep Singh Puri also watched the race finale with the CM. This is the first time that the MotoGP was held in India.

winner's trophy was shaped like the map of India," he said.

Before he attended the race, the CM held a meeting with the Haryana Textile Association and a delegation of farmers at the Gautam Buddha University guest house and heard their problems. He assured them that any issue pertaining to them that comes before the government will be resolved on priority.
