from 11.30am to 12.30pm on Saturday, followed by a series of sessions of academic institutions like Sharda University, Gautam Buddha University and Shiv Nadar University from 12.30pm to 1.30pm. A session on Logistics, Supply chain and Time Management by the Mumbai Dabbawala will be held from 2.30pm to 4pm. There will be a session of UP Electronics Corporation Ltd from 11.30am to 12.30pm on Sunday while a fashion show is scheduled from 6.30pm to 7.30pm, organised by NIFT Rae Bareli and the Khadi department. The award ceremony on the final day will also be open to only a select few.

"Cultural programmes have also been organised in which renowned artists will perform. There will be sufi music on the first day. On the second day, there will be a presentation of Riddham Rasarang, Sugam Sangeet and a performance by the band Anunaad. The third day will performances feature 'Ram Gaan' folk singing and Shri Radha Madhav ballet. On the fourth day, a Kathak dance drama based on Ramayana will be presented while on the last day, Shiv Tandav and a music show will be held," said the spokesperson.
