

# Govt exploring scope of AI in diagnostics in rural UP

**Lucknow:** Possibilities of artificial intelligence (AI) based diagnostics in rural areas of the Uttar Pradesh is currently being explored, said ministers and senior government officials during The Economic Times Vision Conclave on Friday.

They said the state government was trying to provide diagnostic services in some community health centres in remote areas through AI based technology.

Also, three centres of excellence have been set up to strengthen delivery of services with the help of AI and machine learning.

Speaking on the occasion, deputy chief minister Brajesh Pathak said the Yogi government was determined to improve the living standards of both urban and rural population.

"In a day close to 5 lakh surgeries are done in government hospitals and health centres. From 13 medical colleges till 2016-17 we are soon going to have 65 medical colleges. I request all the stakeholders to come forward and share the action plan to make the state better

Chief secretary DS Mishra said the state was committed to set up India's first AI city in Lucknow.
