## Asks MSMEs To Gear Up For '24 Int'l Trade Show



Lucknow: Chief minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday said that the end of 'inspector raj' was a watershed moment in the history of Uttar Pradesh, following which the state has gone on to realise its potential on every front.

line Incentive Platform, CM Yogi underscored their remarkable contributions to enhancing investment possibilities and streamlining facilities for entrepreneurs within the state. "UP's ranking in ease of doing business was at 14th place six years ago. Extensive reforms were made to this. The result is in front of everyone," he stated.

The CM said that whether it is the work of creating a land bank within the state or establishing better law and order, remarkable work has been done on every front. "Investment proposals totalling Rs 40 lakh crore were received through the Global Investors Summit held in February 2023. The International Trade Show held in Greater Noida in September was also very successful," he said.

"Over 70,000 buyers came to the show while the total footprint was 4 lakh. More than 400 foreign buyers also visited the show. This showcased the remarkable potential of the new Uttar Pradesh of New India," Yogi said.

"While it took 46 years to develop Noida and Greater Noida, we are currently working rapidly towards a new industrial setup in Jhansi, Bundelkhand.
