Global city Ayodhya now connected to country and world, says Scindia

Ayodhya: Union railway minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and Union civil aviation minister Jyotiraditya Scindia praised the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and administration of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath during a public meeting in Ayodhya on Saturday.

They said that the PM's resolution to return the glory of Treta Yuga to 'divya, navya and bhavya' Ayodhya was being fulfilled under CM Yogi.

They said December 30 would be recorded in golden letters in the history of Ayodhya.

sing development due to the PM's vision," Vaishnaw said.

Highlighting development in railway sector, he said that from 2009 to 2014, only Rs 11,000 crore was allocated to UP for railways. "Now, railways in UP are being developed with a budget of Rs 17,100 crore. The PM has dedicated railway projects worth Rs 20,300 crore to the country. Every station in UP has undergone transformation, including electrification works," he said. The civil aviation minister, Jyotiradi-

tya Scindia said that awaited moment of thousands of years was now approaching culmination.

"While India is emerging as an economic powerhouse globally, the PM's effort is also to make the world aware of India's spiritual strength," he added. He said, "Now, airplanes like Boeing and Airbus will also land in Ayodhya and flights to Delhi and Ahmedabad will be operated from here. Ayodhya will be connected to every corner of India."

"Opposition parties' governments neglected Ayodhya and denied the existence of Lord Shri Ram, while PM Modi is making efforts to revive Ayodhya's lost glory. This has been made possible due to 'Modi ki guarantee'," Scindia added.
