

Uttar Pradesh greenlights 72-km RRTS corridor from Ghaziabad to Noida airport

Earlier this October, the UP government and YEIDA had requested the National Capital Region Transport Corporation (NCRTC) to explore two RRTS routes — one from Delhi's Sarai Kale Khan via DND Flyway, Noida Expressway, and Yamuna Expressway to the greenfield airport, and another through Greater Noida West and the central part of Greater Noida city to the Jewar airport.

The Uttar Pradesh government has reportedly given the green light to a 72 km-long Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) corridor. This corridor will link Ghaziabad's 17 km priority section to the upcoming Noida International Airport in Jewar.

The project, estimated at Rs 1,600 crore, received approval during a meeting chaired by Uttar Pradesh Chief Secretary DS Mishra on December 4.
