## Ayodhya gets zero carbon e-vehicle transport service



15 EV Plus four-wheelers have already been rolled out in Ayodhya

Ayodhya: The Yogi Adityanath government has begun equipping Ayodhya with zero-carbon emission e-vehicle transport facility.

As directed by the Chief Minister, action plan has been prepared on which Ayodhya Development Authority (ADA) has started working. In the first phase, 15 EV Plus four-wheelers with seating capacity of four passengers each have been rolled out in Ayodhya. Preference is to Tata Tigor EV cars manufactured under the 'Make in India' initiative.

Service of e-cart, manufactured by Chinese company in Ayodhya, has been operational since Deepotsav event last year.

Each cart has seating capacity of six passengers and helps mainly elderly devotees commute to Hanumangarhi and Shri Ram Janmabhoomi temple complex.

On Tuesday, e-vehicle transport started between Lucknow and Ayodhya, by ADA, through private partnership. 200 vehicles will soon be included in the fleet.

VVIP movement, ding of artists and tourists, is proposed in Ayodhya between Makar Sankranti (January 15) and January 22. Passion International private limited is providing cab service with the name of 'My EV Plus'. Director of the company, Prashant Garg, said the pick and drop service is for pilgrims arriving at Ayodhya airport from January 6 and is operational throughout Ayodhya, and can be accessed on WhatsApp number 9799499299.

The service has also been started to and from Lucknow and Ayodhya and passengers for Rs 3,000 for one-way journey. In Ayodhya, passengers will have to pay Rs 250 for a journey of 0 to 10 km, Rs 399 for a journey of 0 to 15 km, Rs 499 for a journey of 0 to 20 km, Rs 799 for a journey of 20 to 30 km and Rs 999 for a journey of 30 to 40 km.
