

PM Modi Inaugurates Integrated Industrial Township In Greater Noida

PM Modi also launched and laid the foundation stone for other development projects worth over Rs 19,100 crore in the run-up to the Lok Sabha elections 2024.

Greater Noida: During a rally held in Uttar Pradesh's Bulandshahr district on Thursday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the 'Integrated Industrial Township, Greater Noida' (IITGN), sprawling across 750 acres. The township, equipped with essential facilities for industry, trade, and business, aims to rival the world's leading manufacturing cities.

Developed at an estimated cost of Rs 1,700 crore by the Integrated Industrial Township Greater Noida Limited (IITGNL), a collaboration between the Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC) and Greater Noida Authority, the project signifies a significant leap towards bolstering industrial growth in the region.

In addition to inaugurating the IITGN, Prime Minister Modi launched and laid the foundation stone for various development projects collectively valued at over Rs 19,100 crore ahead of the Lok Sabha elections in 2024.

Officials from the Greater Noida Authority highlighted that eight prominent companies have already invested in the township, including Haier Electronics, Formae Mobile, Satkriti Infotainment, Chenfeng (LED company), Jworld Electronics, and Guru Amardass. These investments, totalling over Rs 4,000 crore, have generated employment opportunities for approximately 11,000 youth, as reported by *The Indian Express*.

During his address, Prime Minister Modi underscored the central government's efforts to establish four new industrial smart cities across the country.

Among the projects launched by Prime Minister Modi were the resurfacing of a 60-metre-wide service road from Balak Inter College to Char Murti Rotary in Greater Noida West, and a similar road from Graziano Rotary to Hanuman Mandir Rotary in Greater Noida West.

Furthermore, foundation stones were laid for the construction of an underpass at Gaur Chowk (Char Murti Chowk) in Greater Noida West and a foot overbridge at eight places.
