logi's fresh assertion came a day after he ordered cancellation of the UP police constable recruitment examination, conducted on Feb 17-18, after allegations of paper leak. In the last few days, police have arrested or detained over 240 people suspected of using unfair means during the examination, prompting the CM to take a perceptibly strong step.

"The elements playing with the future of youth will have no place to go. Wo ab na ghar ke rahenge na ghaat ke...," he said, adding his govt has decided to take action to set a 'nazeer' (precedent).

Yogi said his govt ensured that no candidate faced any discrimination or

required any 'sifarish' (recommendation) at any step of the recruitment process. "Now you need to focus on results. The govt's aim is development while being sensitive to the welfare of the poor," he said.

The CM exhorted the new recruits to help in fast-tracking procedural functioning of their respective department. "People engaged in ill practices will face govt's wrath and may face termination of their services," he cautioned.

Yogi maintained that nearly 34 lakh employment opportunities were knocking the doors of UP after the recent Ground Breaking Ceremony in which investment proposals worth over Rs 10 lakh crore have been implemented.

"About 34 lakh youth had to migrate to states like Maharashtra, Delhi, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Gujarat in search of jobs but today they do not need to go anywhere. They are getting jobs in their own district and their own state," said Yogi, adding that Rs 40 lakh crore received during the UP Global Investors Summit 2023 would change the picture of the state.
