

Design courses according to industry's demands: CM

Addresses Youngsters At Mega Job Fair

Gorakhpur: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Sunday called upon technical institutions to understand the demands of the industry and design courses accordingly. "Youth should be guaranteed both jobs and security," he said while addressing a mega Rozgar Mela and the appointment letter distribution ceremony of newly selected candidates on the Madan Mohan Malviya University of Technology (MMMUT) campus.

Highlighting that UP received investment proposals worth Rs 40 lakh crore during the Global Investors Summit held last year, which will provide employment to 1.10 crore youths, he said: "It is essential to con-

nect the youth with training for their empowerment. There is also a need for including them in the CM Internship Program, wherein the government and the industry jointly fund their stipends with each contributing 50% of the amount, allowing them to be self-reliant during their education."

Expressing satisfaction over the Rozgar Mela being organized at MMMUT for the second time in a year, benefitting nearly 15,000 young individuals, CM Yogi encouraged those still seek-

ing placements to persist in their efforts. He assured them of the government's active commitment to creating ample employment opportunities.

He said that this was New Uttar Pradesh of New India and skilled workers from UP were in high demand across the globe. "Against the target of 1,200, Isarel has hired 5,000 youths from Uttar Pradesh and demanding even more workers. Those selected will not only receive salary of Rs 1.5 lakh, but also get free meals and accommodation after completing their ITI courses."

Uttar Pradesh has collaborated with Israel, Russia, and Germany to provide international job opportunities to youths, he said.

Urging youths to take language training to prepare better, he said: "There is also a high demand for skilled nursing professionals in Germany. There is also a demand for skilled youths in the Middle East

and Southeast Asian countries... Career counselling for youths should be done through a placement cell to make them aware of job opportunities in the country and abroad. Youths also need to be trained in the language of that country."

"Providing employment to everyone is the top priority of Uttar Pradesh govt today. Govt, through the vocational education department, has worked on sending youths to Israel, Russia, and Germany," he underlined.

He said efforts need to be made with the skill development department to make the youths competent and provide language training by initiating programs for it. Keeping this in mind, the government, along with Tata Technology, is planning to establish 150 world-class ITIs. Yogi said that there are 96 lakh units in MSMEs in Uttar Pradesh which need to enhance their facilities by integrating with the market and technology.
