Each of you possesses extensive experience in public life, having shouldered significant responsibilities. It is expected that our youth will benefit from your experiences, and your support in this endeavour is highly appreciated,"

The CM said that initiatives like the Investors Summit and GBC were being held primarily for the youth, as these programmes would create jobs. He said that govt was also holding programmes for skilling the youth to make them suitable for the industry.

Pointing out that UP had been ridden with inequalities where west and central UP had seen significant development over east and Bun-

delkhand. Yogi said this had forced a lot of youth to migrate out of the state. Efforts like the Investors Summit. were an attempt to correct this wrong.
