Connecting the corridor with the Bundelkhand Expressway will also be done. Additionally, concrete steps will be taken to ensure that municipal corporation transportation is not affected due to heavy traffic.

Not only that, they have been instructed to explore new possibilities of income so that there is no shortage of funds for development work.
