Uttar Pradesh's GSDP rose to ₹25.48 lakh cr in 2023-24

UP Economic Growth Rate 8% In 2023-24

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh's gross state domestic product (GSDP) rose to Rs 25.48 lakh crore in 2023-24, up from Rs 22.58 lakh crore in 2022-23. The data was shared during a review of the planning department on Friday, where CM Yogi Adityanath discussed the publication of the District Domestic Product (DDP) Estimates Uttar Pradesh 2022-23 booklet.

The CM was also informed that UP's economic growth rate was 8% in 2023-

24. Issuing guidelines for the booklet, Yogi said that it should include data like UP's GSDP, DDP of districts and their percentage share in the state. It should include the annual growth of both the districts and the state, the per capita income of each district, the per capita income of UP, and a comparative analysis of each district and the state.

"Data from DDP estimate booklet should be distributed to universities and Krishi Vigvan Kendras in UP. Research work should be advanced based on this data," he said.

He said govt was moving towards calculating GDPs of villages and districts in recognising that panchayats and urban bodies were the foundation of the state. Efforts were underway to make panchavats and urban bodies self-reliant, he said, adding that over the past seven years, major progress has been made in infrastructure development in the state and urbanisation has increased. Consequently, per capita income of people also increased.

"A self-reliant society will form the foundation of a selfreliant India. In seven years, extensive changes have occurred in every sector within the state, and the transformation in the state's work culture is visible. UP ranks first in the country in terms of capital expenditure, allocating the highest budget for infrastructure development compared to other states. The integration of technology and corruption-free governance has led to a noticeable increase in the state's revenue over the past seven years," he said.

The CM also spoke about the planning department's flagship project, the Family ID scheme, and said that it was dedicated to promoting planned development in the state. He said that data collection efforts should be advanced using Family ID, ensuring better collection methods and timely updates. Individuals involved in data collection should receive proper training and a database of birth and death certificates should be developed, he said.
