THE UTTAR Pradesh State Industrial Development Authority (UPSIDA) has announced a major development initiative for the Trans Ganga City with the approval of an infrastructure project.

In a board meeting chaired by UP chief secretary Manoj Kumar Singh, the construction of a new four-lane bridge over the Ganga has been approved.

This bridge will span approximately 1.8 km, connecting Kanpur to Trans Ganga City. The project, estimated to cost around Rs 538.10 crore, is anticipated to be completed within 36 months.

Alongside the bridge, a network of access roads, spanning 2.1 km, will be constructed to facilitate seamless connectivity and enhance regional transportation.

The [Uttar Pradesh](#) State Bridge Corporation has been appointed as the nodal agency for this project, responsible for managing the construction process, ensuring adherence to quality standards, and meeting the project's timeline.

According to a release, in conjunction with this major infrastructure development, UPSIDA offers opportunities for plots available in Trans Ganga City.

The region offers a range of plots to support diverse industrial, residential, and commercial activities, the release said.

As many as 226 industrial plots are ideal for setting up manufacturing and industrial ventures and 38 commercial plots are available for businesses looking to establish a presence in Trans Ganga City. This new bridge and the accompanying infrastructure are poised to revolutionise connectivity in the region, fostering economic growth and enhancing access between Kanpur and Trans Ganga City.
