'UP govt aims to create 70k jobs in Ayodhya division'

Lucknow/Ayodhya: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has set the target of creating 50,000 jobs for youths in Ayodhya and 20,000 in neighbouring Ambedkarnagar, and to ensuring all-round development of Ayodhya division, a govt spokesperson said.

"Gifting projects worth Rs 32,000 crore, the CM has been ensuring progress and transformation of Ayodhya. He is focusing on connecting local youths with education, health, and self-reliance initiatives," he said.

"The Maharana Pratap Education Council in Gorakhpur has benefitted lakhs of students in the past. CM Yogi is committed to implementing the same scheme in Ayodhya," the spokesperson said.

On Saturday, the CM handed over appointment letters to around 7,000 youths in Ambedkarnagar to create avenues for self-employment. Furthermore, 13,866 youths from 59 colleges received tablets as a gift. On Sunday, Yogi gifted tablets and smartphones to 3,415 youths in Ayodhya.

"The CM's goal is to connect over 70,000 youths in Ayodhya and Ambedkarnagar with jobs and employment opportunities. He has set the target of creating 50,000 jobs in Ayodhya and 20,000 opportunities in Ambedkarnagar," the spokesperson said.

"Since taking over the governance in the state, Yogi has allocated around Rs 62 crore from the discretionary fund for the treatment of 3,611 patients from Ayodhya. Similarly, in Ambedkarnagar, Rs 42 crore were distributed in the accounts of 2,834 individuals for better treatment," he said.
