Lucknow: Dredging activity and programmes being carried out by the irrigation department have resulted in mitigating the flood situation in 18 districts of Uttar Pradesh.

Having restored the original course of rivers that cause flooding through dredging, the situation of towns located along Ghaghra, Saryu, Rapti, Ram Ganga and Sharda has been better this time.

The stall of the irrigation department at the international trade show in Greater Noida Expo is attracting a lot of engineering students interested in learning the dredging process. The digital LED screens and touchscreens put up at the stall have been showcasing the elaborate works that the department does to prevent floods, provide water through the wide network of canals and bigticket projects it has executed. The state has a network of 132 dams that play a crucial

role in flood prevention and power generation, while 20 barrages are maintained by the department to supply water into the canals. The stall also offers a digital map of such assets Uttar Pradesh possesses. Out of the 241 lakh hectares of land in UP, almost 30% get affected due to the floods. Over the years, 523 embankments spanning over 3,869 km have been constructed.

Girja Barrage, Bhimgoda Barrage and Rihand Dam are among the projects that are generating the maximum interest.
