PRAYAGRAJ




Home to the Kumbh Mela, one of the largest congregations of faith anywhere in the world, Prayagraj sits at the confluence of three most sacred rivers—the Ganga, the Yamuna, and the mythical Saraswati—the holy Sangam. Around 25 crore people

visited Kumbh 2019, whereas authorities are expecting a turnout of around 40 crore in Maha Kumbh 2025 for which the state government has allocated a budget of more than Rs 5100 crore in the last two years, and started making preparations,

PREPARATION FOR MAHA KUMBH 2025

- In 2019, the event covered 3200 hectares; this year, it will expand to over 4000 hectares
- Over 1.5 lakh toilets to be installed, 10,000 employees to maintain cleanliness
- Development of infrastructure such as parking facilities, ponson bridges, bathing ghats, street lighting, and toilets to meet the anticipated demand
- Development of parking locations within the fair area—no more than 5 km from the Sangam
- Efforts are underway to deploy 7,000 buses for the mega mela in 2025
- Beautification efforts are currently underway on seven riverfront roads, 14 railway overbridges (ROBs), and seven historic ghats in Prayagraj
- Construction of six lane bridge
- Construction of the new airport terminal to be completed by October



Hailed as the 'Vatican of the East', Ayodhya takes centrestage for devotees of Lord Ram. Known as the home and kingdom of Lord Ram, Ayodhya is a pivotal destination when it comes to spiritual and religious tourism. The Sri Ram Janmabhoomi Mandir, after the consecration ceremony, has captured:

KASHI

Shri Kashi Vishwanath Dham with the nucleus—Shri Kashi Vishwanath Temple—is the most revered and famous of the lot. The Dham, a cluster of temples, is abuzz with worshippers throughout the day and it is said that a mere glimpse of the

Jyotirlinga is believed to be a soul-purifying experience. To cater to the needs of the pilgrims, the Dham has been equipped with a range of modern amenities like ecan and well-maintained restrooms, drinking water facilities, resting areas, etc.

CIRCUIT OF WONDERS

- G**etting to explore a vast state like Uttar Pradesh in much easier with well-defined circuits as per traveller's choice and interest. UP has thematic tourism locations defined into circuits—each including places of common interest, which can be covered by a traveller. All circuits have well-planned infrastructure and an astounding mix of sights, culture, nature, and history.
- GANAYANA CIRCUIT:** This circuit hosts spiritual and religious sites of UP that correlate with Lord Hanuman and events in his life. This includes cities like Ayodhya, for instance.
 - BUNDELKHAND CIRCUIT:** This circuit includes all areas that have been recognised under the Bundelkhand region of UP. This circuit has all kinds of tourist places based on themes like ancient, medieval, nature, wildlife and adventure.
 - KRISHNA-BRAJ CIRCUIT:** This circuit has all the areas that are called Braj Bhumi—places associated with Lord Krishna and his times.
 - MAHABHARAT CIRCUIT:** This circuit covers/connects locations in UP that are related to the grand epic, The Mahabharat.
 - SWATANTRATA SANGRAM CIRCUIT:** This circuit highlights locations and cities of UP that have contributed or were related to the freedom struggle movement of India.
 - BUDDHIST CIRCUIT:** These sites include places and artifacts associated with Lord Buddha. Prominent locations in UP

WELLNESS & MEDICAL TOURISM



The holistic appeal of Uttar Pradesh is not confined to its architectural marvels or igloos landmarks. UP is also the land of sages and saints, with natural healing practices deep rooted in the region. The integration of health and wellness into the tourism landscape reflects UP's commitment to promoting a harmonious coexistence of traditional wisdom and modern comforts. As a result, UP is poised to witness a surge in eco-friendly resorts, wellness centres and Ayurvedic retreats, emerging as a leader in the wellness tourism market.

Uttar Pradesh has a strong presence of a combined total of more than 30,000 Sub Centres (SCs), Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), and sub-district hospitals. It has a 3-tier public healthcare infrastructure and private healthcare services. As with a rapidly growing base of 'Jan Aushadhi' Parivarshans Centres, the state has 1 lakh pharmacists and 86,000+ retail pharmacies.

TIME FOR NIGHT SAFARI: INDIA'S FIRST

Kukrali Zoo and Night Safari is coming up on 2,027 hectares of forest area in Lucknow, as part of UP government's initiative to boost ecotourism and ensure wildlife conservation in UP. It is going to be India's first urban night safari.



PROJECT TIGER AND PROJECT ELEPHANT

The number of tourists visiting UP's tiger reserves saw a significant increase in the 2023-24 season (until June 14, 2024) compared to 2022-23. Compared to the previous year, a substantial influx of both Indian and foreign tourists chose Uttar Pradesh as their destination. The tiger reserves attracted more than 1 lakh visitors, indicating a growing interest among travellers seeking wildlife experiences in the region.

- Project Tiger and Project Elephant:** are paving the way for the conservation of tigers and elephants in UP. This has opened opportunities for increased revenue through tourism development in the state, while also enhancing avenues for the conservation of tigers, elephants and other protected wildlife.
- Construction activities are underway in the core area reserves of forests, including the construction of water bodies.
- Uttar Pradesh Forest Corporation is consistently providing facilities such as tourist accommodations, luxury Tata Xenon Safar vehicles, and boat safaris across various tiger reserves in the state.
- To enhance tourist convenience, online booking facilities are available via the Uttar Pradesh Forest Corporation Ecotourism website, offering opportunities to experience nature up close and enjoy jungle tours.
