## State's investment potential attracts UP diaspora in Dubai

## Key Biz Grps Interested In Select Sectors

Lucknow: The potential to invest in Uttar Pradesh received massive interest at a UP Diaspora Investor Meet held in Dubai recently. Several individuals and important business groups expressed interest in specific sectors, pledging huge investments in the state.

At the programme organised by Invest UP and UPDF Diaspora, minister of state (independent charge) Ravindra Jaiswal highlighted the initiatives taken by the state govt to promote investment in UP and spoke about the 25 sectoral policies issued to promote the development of specific sectors.

stem in UP and the initiatives of Invest UP.

The team also invited the UP diaspora in Dubai to visit key religious sites in the state such as Varanasi, Mathura, Ayodhya, Lucknow, and Prayagraj.
