

Over 62% of civil works for completion of Ganga e-way over

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While the 165-km Yamuna Expressway would be the primary route to reach Jewar airport in Greater Noida, linking it further with the 594-km Ganga Expressway would help increase the volume of air passengers. Individuals and families from Meerut, Hapur, Bulandshahr, and Amroha would find it easier to commute between the two sides once the link expressway becomes operational. Officials said the Jewar link expressway would also serve as an intermediary route for motorists wanting to reach

the Yamuna Expressway to access Noida, Greater Noida, Faridabad, and other parts of the NCR via the Ganga Expressway.

Meanwhile, more than 62% of the civil works required for the completion of the Ganga Expressway have been achieved. In fact, dense bitumen macadam (surface of the road carriage-way) has also been laid down over that portion of the road stretch. The state govt has directed UPEIDA to open the expressway for vehicular movement from Dec 24, as providing connectivity between Meerut and Prayagraj ahead of Maha Kumbh is extremely important.
