## **Committed to making farmers self-reliant: CM**

## UP, Netherlands Sign MoU For Agri Innovation

Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Friday said that Uttar Pradesh plays a vital role in the field of agriculture as it contributes 20% of total agricultural output despite having only 11% of country's cultivable land.

Inaugurating a four-day event, Krishi Bharat-2024, in Vrindavan Yojana, the CM said that efforts were being made to ensure that farmers became self-reliant.

Yogi also attended a bilateral meeting with the partner country, the Netherlands, and met a delegation led by the country's Vice-Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries, Food Security, and Nature, Jan-Kees Goet, and Ambassador to India, Marisa Gerards. The CM also inaugurated the exhibition at the Netherlands pavilion and visited exhibition stalls.

Amemorandum of understanding was signed between the UP govt and the Netherlands as a step to strengthen agricultural innovation and cooperation.

"In the past decade, significant efforts were made across the country to free farmers from the burden of high-interest loans and guide them towards self-reliance. However, there is still room for improvement," the CM said.

"Our focus should be on advancing agricultural sector with enhanced technology. Given the diverse agro-cli-

The CM emphasized Uttar Pradesh's vital role in Indian agriculture, noting that while the state accounts for 17% of India's population (25 crore) and only 11% of the country's cultivable land, it contributes 20% of the nation's total agricultural output. "This remarkable achievement reflects the state's abundant water resources and fertile land," he said.

Highlighting the untapped potential, the CM said that with the integration of digital agriculture and advanced technologies, agricultural productivity could in-

crease by 3-4 times.

"There is a need to reduce agricultural costs, adopt modern technology, and minimise reliance on chemical fertilizer by utilising natural resources," he said.

He expressed satisfaction over discussions with the Netherlands Ambassador during her recent visit to Uttar Pradesh.

"The MoUs between Uttar Pradesh and the Netherlands, including govt-to-govt and business-to-business collaborations, mark a significant step forward in agricultural innovation and cooperation. The Netherlands, with its expertise in affordable, sustainable technology, provides valuable insights," the CM added.

Netherlands vice-minister for agriculture Jan-Kees Goet said, "The Netherlands is known for its agricultural ability and use of technology in agricultural sector. All challenges can be dealt with through partnership and coordination between India and the Netherlands."
