

# Jewar airport will boost industrial infra, employment generation: CM

## 'Jewar Region Will Be Most Developed'

**Lucknow:** Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Friday said that the establishment of the Noida International Airport will lead to the development of industrial infrastructure, increase employment opportunities, promote manufacturing and exports, facilitate air travel and significantly boost tourism.

"Several industrial sectors have developed near the airport in the Yamuna Authority area. In the coming

days, this region will become a major hub for industrial and service sector activities,"

the CM said.

He added that in the next 10 years, Jewar will become

the most developed region in the country. The CM praised the farmers for their coopera-

tion in the airport's development, mentioning that approximately 3,300 acres of land had been acquired without disputes in just two years.

The CM said that the airport's connectivity will be enhanced through an interchange on the Eastern Peripheral Road which would connect to the Yamuna Expressway. A station will be built near the Airport to connect it with the Delhi-Varanasi high-speed rail.

The state government has approved the DPR for RRTS rail to connect New Delhi with Greater Noida, and it has been sent to the Centre for final approval. The Noida Airport will also be connected to the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway from Ballabgarh.

### NOIDA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT: AN OVERVIEW

- > Site clearance for airport granted in July 2017, in-principle approval given by the Govt of India in May 2018
- > Airport is located along 100m access-controlled Yamuna Expressway
- > A modern interchange is being constructed for connectivity. A 60m service road parallel to the Yamuna Expressway has been constructed to connect the airport
- > License and possession of land given to Zurich Airport

- > Airport is being developed in phases. In first stage, it will have two runways, expanding to five runways in the second stage

- > By 2024-25, airport will have a capacity of 12 million passengers annually with one runway, increasing to 30 million passengers with two runways by 2031

- > Acquisition of 1,365 hectares required for third runway has been completed by the civil aviation dept

- > Total capacity of three runways will be 225 million passengers annually. Total planned capacity of airport is 295 million passengers annually
