his facility will also cater to the eight neighbouring urban local bodies (ULBs).

a) Dry Waste: It will have capacity to process 500 tons of waste daily and will produce charcoal too. Gorakhpur Municipal Corporation (GMC) has signed an MoU with National Thermal Power Corporation, involving an investment of Rs 300 crore.

b) Wet Waste: It will process 200 tons of waste daily and produce bio-CNG under the PPP model. It will help GMC save about Rs 12-15 crore monthly cost on garbage collection vehicles fuel.

c) Hazardous Waste: A separate facility will process domestic hazardous waste using environmentally-friendly methods.
