
## UP inks MoU with Western Sydney University to establish first foreign university campus in state

LUCKNOW: An MoU has been signed virtually on Friday between the Government of Uttar Pradesh and Western Sydney University (WSU), Australia, to establish the first foreign university campus in Uttar Pradesh. This MoU testifies the sheer

commitment of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath to enhance the entire education realm of the state, the government said.

This MoU marks a significant beginning of a more employable realm and prepares the ground for the first foreign university in the state. The MoU revolves around two-phased development -- first, the university will run courses in a pre-existing infrastructure and second, the state will provide the university with land and other clearances in the meantime to establish their campus in Greater Noida, the officials said.
