Lucknow: The Maha Kumbh, which is expected to attract more than 40 crore visitors, is likely to see generation of business worth Rs 2 lakh crore, said Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Wednesday. He questioned the intent of those criticising UP govt's expenditure of Rs 5,000 crore on the event.


Justifying govt investment of Rs 5,000 crore on the event, the CM said that the arrival of crores of devotees in the state would see much more revenue come back to govt. "Barely 50 lakh devotees visited Varanasi in a year before 2017, but in 2024 there were 16 crore visitors to the city. In 2016, a total 2.83 lakh domestic devotees and 1,200 foreign tourists visited Ayodhya. Between Jan and Sep 2024, a total 13.55 crore visitors came to Ayodhya. When a devotee visits UP, he uses transport, eats in a restaurant, lives in a hotel, shops, etc., and spends an average of Rs 5,000 per visit. By that calculation, just Varanasi earns Rs 80,000 crore," the CM said.

Hitting out at the Opposition, the CM said that those questioning the UP govt were those who feel pride in their association with foreign invaders and not India. He accused them of not liking the development of Ayodhya, Prayagraj, Mathura-Vrindavan, or Varanasi as they worked to divide on caste, religious, and regional lines.

"Some people might not like how much work has been

done. Prayagraj is such an ancient city and has been leading India's spiritual growth. This city, which propelled some people to the height of power, was left ignored since Independence. It was Prime Minister Narendra Modi who planned sustainable growth for the city," the CM said.
