

Nod to land for DTIS facility in Lko node of defence corridor

LUCKNOW: The Uttar Pradesh cabinet okayed a proposal to give land free to set up Defence Testing Infrastructure Scheme (DTIS) facility in the Lucknow node of Defence Industrial Corridor project, on Monday.

Chief minister Yogi Adityanath presided over the meeting of the state cabinet that approved a proposal to develop .80-hectare land for the purpose. The cost of land to be transferred is estimated to be Rs 94.19 lakh.

An official spokesman said the DITS facility would function as a common testing facility

centre that the defence manufacturing units would use for testing and certification of their products. The spokesman said this would lead to increased demand of these products in and outside India. The development of DITS facility would attract investment and lead to the creation of jobs as well.

Kanpur mills' land transfer okayed

The state cabinet approved a proposal to transfer 451.20 acre land of the now closed spinning mills of Uttar Pradesh Cooperative Spinning Mills Federation Limited Kanpur free of cost to UPSIDA.

The land of the closed spinning mills would be transferred

for development of a land bank for new industrial units to be set up in Uttar Pradesh.

The land of the closed spinning mills is available at Mehmoodabad, Sitapur, Fatehpur, Prayagraj, Ghazipur, Farrukhanbad and Bulandshahr.

Nod to land transfer for tourist facilities

The state cabinet approved another proposal to transfer .850-hectare government's barren land in Dahi village of Haridoi for development of facilities for tourists around Dadhichi Kund in Misrikh, Sitapur, around 12 km from Naimisharanya, Sitapur and 100 km from Lucknow.
