Yogi sets ₹30.77L cr GSDP target as UP outpaced national average

Lucknow: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thurs-

day set a target of achieving a Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) of Rs 30.77 lakh crore in 2025–26, noting that the current GSDP stands at Rs 27.51 lakh crore, up

from Rs 12.75 lakh crore, which the BJP govt inherited when it came to power in 2017.

A govt spokesperson said the state has outpaced the national average in GSDP growth. "While India's GDP growth stood at 9.6% in 2023–24, UP recorded an impressive 11.6% growth rate,

placing it ahead of several major states and reaffirming the success of the Yogi Adityanath govt's economic model," he said.

The growth, he added, can be attributed

to several factors including massive infrastructure development, a focused push for industrialisation, businessfriendly reforms, and improved law and order. "These changes have brought major development to the state and attracted investments worth several hundred crores across multiple sectors, driving industrialisation and employment," the official said, adding that this marked a significant turnaround from the pre-2017 scenario.

The Indian Industries Association (IIA) also credited the improved business climate to enhanced law and order under the current govt.

Ayodhya division president of IIA, Pramit Kumar Singh said the CM's policies have helped the state advance on the path of development.
